The Pastor's Journal

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as Corpus Christi, celebrates the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. This feast emphasizes the importance of the Eucharist as both a sacrament and a



sacrifice, where bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. It's a time for reflection on Christ's gift of himself for our salvation and a call to unity and charity within the Church.

The core belief is that Jesus Christ is truly, and substantially present in the Eucharist, under the appearances of bread and wine. The Eucharist is both a sacrament--a visible sign of God's grace, and a sacrifice--a representation of Christ's sacrifice on the cross.

The Eucharist nourishes our souls and unites us with Christ and with one another in his Body, the Church. The Church teaches that the bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ through transubstantiation, while retaining the appearance of bread and wine.

Reflect on the incredible gift of the Eucharist and the love of Christ that it represents. Consider how you can actively participate in the Mass and receive the Eucharist with reverence, worthiness and devotion. Think about how the Eucharist calls you to love and serve others, mirroring Christ's self-giving love.

Pray for the unity of the Church and for all Christians to recognize the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Reflect on your own experience of receiving the Eucharist and how it has nourished your faith.

Understanding the Mass



The Mass now leads us to re-live the suffering, torture, crucifixion, and death of Jesus as the Sacrificial Lamb (known as the Passion), and his resurrection and

ascension into heaven. This is done through these simple words: "O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the saving Passion of your Son, his wondrous Resurrection and Ascension into heaven, and as we look forward to his second coming, we offer you in thanksgiving this holy and living sacrifice."

This quote is from the third Eucharistic prayer of the Consecration, similar words are found in the first and second Eucharistic prayers. The priest chooses which Eucharistic prayer is used at each Mass he celebrates.
